LEARNING GOALS

The aim of the course is to develop the critical ability necessary for the practice of architecture, which necessarily passes through the knowledge of history. The student will be encouraged to know and read the architecture (from the building to the territorial systems) through different points of observation (construction techniques; materials used; aesthetic and symbolic

considerations; personality of the craftsman and the client; relations with the decorative apparatus pictorial and sculptural).

The student will have to critically recognize the architecture (from the Renaissance to the late Baroque age) according to the material, constructive, cultural peculiarities of each historical phase and, moreover, will have to be able to read an artifact in its diachronic dimension.

- the Baroque age (Gianlorenzo Bernini, Francesco Borromini, Pietro Berrettini from Cortona)
- the baroque city (Rome, Naples)
- developments of the Baroque in southern Italy
- picture of the European situation between the 17th and 18th centuries
